





A FEATURE CAKE MUST BE COOKED TO THE FOLLOWING RECIPE.

MARBLE CAKE:

Ingredients: 185g sugar, 1 ½ cups SR flour, 1/2 cup milk, few drops vanilla essence, 125g butter, 2 eggs, 2 tsp. cocoa, hot water, pinch salt. *Method* Place all ingredients, except cocoa and water, into a small mixing bowl and mix at low speed until combined. Then beat on high for 4 minutes only. Divide mixture into three, colour one pink, one chocolate (by combining cocoa and water and mixing to form a paste) and leave one white. Line the bottom of a 20cm round tin. Place mixture in alternate spoonfuls and run a knife through mixture to give a marbled effect. Bake in a 190 oven for 25 to 40 minutes or until cooked. When cool, ice on top with pale pink icing.






