



A: We are excited to announce a new light feeder class in the store cattle section.

3. Q: What incentives are there for producers to enter in the prime and/or store cattle classes at the Taroom Show?

A: Taroom is a very proud beef production region of Queensland and there are numerous producers of excellent quality cattle in the area who stand a strong chance of receiving recognition for their work. Besides that, the beef show builds on its very attractive prize money year in year out and you've got to be happy with that!
