

HORSE RULES & REGULATIONS

The following is a brief outline of horse rules:

Full rules can be found in the horse schedule or at http://showday.online. Competitors must make themselves familiar with the full horse rules.

Chief Steward

The chief steward shall have final say in all decisions regarding any event and entrance into events. The chief steward has the ability to alter or remove any event in the Taroom Show schedule.

Any competitor or persons associated displaying disruptive or offensive behaviour at the discretion of the chief steward will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and excluded from participating in any further events at the Taroom Show.

Rider Safety & Waiver

<u>All riders, inc competitors in led/handler classes, must sign a waiver</u> before competing in the Taroom Show. Waivers are available at the secretary office. Once completed, riders will receive a wrist bands to be worn whilst competing. Stewards will ask all competitors to show their wrist bands before competing in an event. Competitors under the age of 18 must have a parent/guardian sign on their behalf. <u>Competitors ride at their own risk.</u> Each competitor must acknowledge that it is a condition of acceptance of their nomination that the show society committee will not be responsible in any respect for injury, loss or damage, personally or otherwise which may be suffered by them in consequence of or in any way arising out of their attendance at or participation in the show. He/she must agree for themselves, their executors and administrators to indemnify the Taroom Show Society and its members in respect to any such claim.

Biosecurity

Taroom Showgrounds is biosecurity controlled. All horse owners entering the grounds <u>must complete a Horse Health Declaration</u> and deliver it to the show office before competing.

Nominations

Nominations can be made through http://showday.online. Nominations open Thursday 1st April and close Monday 26th April 2021 at 5pm. Changes and/or cancellations AFTER THIS DATE, can be emailed to taroomshowhorses@hotmail.com or Emmi Menzies 0498 016 110. No refunds or nomination withdraws will be made after the closing date on April 26th 5pm - Refunds will only be paid on the following basis – In writing with a vet or medical certificate and the discretion of the show committee. All refunds to be dealt after the show, no earlier than Tuesday 11th May and no later than Friday 14th May. No refunds will be made during the show.

Prize Money

Prize monies and trophies will be distributed at the end of each class. If not collected at the time, can be claimed at the secretaries office at the discretion of the secretary in consultation with the results sheets. Prize monies and trophies not collected by 5pm Tuesday 4th May will be forfeited.

Protests/Disputes

In the event of a dispute, the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies shall apply. "Any protest by an exhibitor must be lodged in writing with the committee person or steward in charge of any section within 30 minutes of the completion of the event together with a fee determined by the committee of this society. The fee will be forfeited if the protest is considered to be frivolous or vexatious. The protest shall be heard according to the rules of the natural justice by a dispute committee of three appointed by the president of this show and the decision by the disputes committee shall be final."

The determined fee for protests/disputes at the Taroom Show is \$50.00.

Horse Health Declaration

All horses entering the Taroom Showgrounds must complete a Horse Health Declaration and be handed in at the show office. Forms are available at www.taroomshow.com.au or show office.

Cattle Tick Free Zone

The Taroom Show Grounds are a cattle tick free zone. Before you move horses from the infested zone to the free zone you must be tick free and have met your cattle tick risk minimisation requirements. You must read and follow the procedures identified in 16b of the Queensland biosecurity manual for the intended movement. There are 3 options provided in the manual that you can use to meet the requirements:

- Owner manual inspection & chemical treatment
- Owner manual inspection & manage your horse in a (tick Free) stated way
- Accredited certifier manual inspection & chemical treatment

You also need to record on the movement record the actions you have taken to meet the requirements.



GENERAL CONDITIONS REGARDING THE PAVILION INDUSTRIES & THE FARM AND PRODUCE SECTIONS

In all cases the competitor must be an amateur. Entry closing date is Sunday 2nd, May 2021 at 5.00pm. Entry fee in all sections will be \$0.50 unless otherwise stated. Prize money will be *First \$3, Second \$2 in all sections, unless otherwise stated.* Where a trophy is donated for first prize, second **prize** will be money only.

This section has been compiled early to assist you with your show entries and the association would be grateful if you would comply by having your entries in **EARLY**. All work **MUST** be new not previously laundered. Articles may be suitably mounted to enable judges to inspect reverse side of work.

In all cases, presentation of an article WILL be considered by the judges. Bottles polished with clean lids are more attractive. Soiled work in any section MAY be disqualified.

All exhibits that have won first prize in a Taroom show are not permissible and, if recognized, will be **DISQUALIFIED**.

Purchased items will not be allowed as a competitive entry. If entries in a section are not worthy of an award no prize will be given. Entries may be moved to a more suitable class at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

Method: Place all ingredients, except cocoa and water, into a small mixing bowl. Mix at low speed until combined, then beat on high for 4 minutes only.

Divide mixture into three, colour one pink, one chocolate (by combining cocoa and water and mixing to form a paste) and leave one white.

Line the bottom of a 20cm round tin.

Place mixture in alternate spoonfuls and run a knife through mixture to give a marbled effect.

Bake in a 190°C oven for 25 to 40 minutes or until cooked. When cool, ice on top with pale pink icing.




